"Heart Facts"

The human heart is about the size of a fist. When you're exercising, it takes your blood about ten seconds to get from your heart to your big toe and back.

"Winter Bug Tips" provide a healthier winter!

Eat Well-for your best shot at staying healthy this winter, make sure you get at least three servings of vegetables each day, and two servings of fresh fruit. In addition, opt for whole grains when you can, and make sure you're taking in at least two servings of milk or yogurt each day.

Wash Your Hands- to be sure you're really washing away the potential viruses and bacteria you've come in contact with, use hot water and really scrub your hands for at least 60 seconds. Get Plenty of Sleep-to make sure your body is fully capable of fighting off illnesses this winter, create a consistent bedtime routine. This should include going to bed at the same time each night so that your body learns to anticipate sleep.

Get a Flu Shot-at the local pharmacy. Or, see your regular doctor, you might consider getting the flu mist, which is a vaccine inhaled through the nasal passages.

"Spicing up Dinner" is great family Fun - spice up your routine with these fun, quick ideas:

Indoor picnic-spread out a blanket on the living-room floor, pack a basket, and "rough it" at your make-believe campsite. **Fabulous fridge burritos**-is your refrigerator full of leftovers? Put them all out on the table, give everyone a tortilla, and let them wrap up their own creations.

Breakfast at bedtime-flip your day around, and have pancakes, eggs, and orange juice for dinner.

Movie night-use your kids' favorite flick for inspiration--make *Lady and the Tramp* spaghetti or *Finding Nemo* fish sticks. **Surprise supper**-play a game, whoever gets the bay leaf in the pasta sauce doesn't have to help clear the table, or the person who gets the hamburger with a pickle on it gets an extra dessert.
