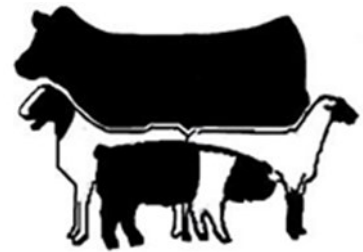

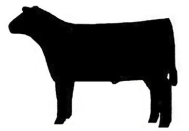

Age: Age divisions are based on the exhibitor's age as of January 1, 2017.

Showmanship Divisions

Novice: 9 and under

Junior: 10-15 years of age

Senior: 16-21 years of age

Exhibitors must be under 21 years of age as of January 1, 2017.

Any animals coming from out of state need to meet and follow NC Health Requirements.

All entry forms and fees must be filed with the show management no later than March 4. Late entries will be accepted at an additional fee.

Decisions of the judge are final.

All animals must meet North Carolina health requirements.

Hogs must be barrows or gilts of any breed or crossbred.

Kids can be wethers or does. (No Bucks)

Kids must have all temporary (milk) teeth in place at the time of the show.

Lambs can be wethers or ewes. (No Rams)

Lambs must have all temporary (milk) teeth in place at the time of the show.

Entries will be divided in classes at the discretion of the show committee.

Exhibitors are responsible for the care of their animals.

Exhibitors and/or their immediate family members found cheating, misrepresenting or participating in fraud or deception or acting in an unsportsmanship like manner, shall be disqualified and possibly barred from future competitions.

The superintendent reserves the right to exclude from competition any entry which is late entering the show ring.

Any disputes or questions are to be directed to the show superintendent.

Any questions not covered by the rules will be ruled upon by the show superintendent.

Animals used in showmanship competition must be entered in the name of the showmanship exhibitor.

Classes for heifers will be broken on age depending on the number of entries. They will not be separated by breed.
