

## **Scheduling Twin Counties Bicycle Safety Education Trailer**

**Reserve the Twin Counties Bicycle Trailer today!** This trailer is a “ready to roll” bicycle safety trailer available for Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Education in schools and local community events in Edgecombe and Nash Counties. The trailer is used to help support schools and community programs to educate children and their caregivers about the importance of bicycle and pedestrian safety. It is intended to be used in Edgecombe and Nash Counties as an educational tool.

How to schedule the trailer for your event(s):

1. Find the trailer request form [HERE](#)
2. You will receive a confirmation that the request has been received. An Edgecombe County Cooperative Extension administrator will contact you regarding the availability of requested dates.
3. If the requested dates are available, you will receive a packet of information which includes trailer lending guidelines and a liability waiver form. Requested dates will receive confirmation email only after the above-mentioned forms have been signed and received.
4. Once the form is signed and returned, the administrator will respond with a confirmation email and provide the school with the student waiver form, the inventory checklist, and specific pick-up/drop-off instructions.
5. The trailer is located at East Carolina Agriculture and Education Center (1175 Kingsboro Road, Rocky Mount, NC). The trailer may be picked up Monday-Friday between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm. The trailer may be picked up and/or dropped off outside of these hours if approved by Extension staff. ***Please be sure to park the trailer in a secure place at your school or community organization.***
6. Upon returning the trailer, please make sure the trailer is locked.

Curriculum binders are also available in the trailer. The Let’s Go NC! Curriculum meets NC Essential Standards of Learning and is primarily for elementary school students. The website includes grade appropriate lesson plans, materials, activities and instructional videos that encourage children to learn about and practice fundamental skills that build safe habits for biking and walking.
